Year 6 Curriculum Newsletter - Summer Term 2

English – Children will be refining, revising and applying a full-range of grammar skills and knowledge from across their curriculum experiences over the years. Regular reading at home and working on Reading Plus will also really benefit the children. Post SATs, children will begin their learning on the Michael Morpurgo short story, *The Giant's Necklace*.

Maths – We will be revisiting a wide range of concepts covered from across Key Stage 2 and applying them to a range of problems and scenarios. As always, revision of the multiplication tables will act as firm foundations for many areas of mathematics; children should use TT Rockstars to help with this.

Science – Our Y6 unit on Electricity will see the children investigating electricity

RE – Children in Y6 will be looking to answer the question, why are Good Friday and Easter Day the most important days for Christians?



PE – Children will continue to learn the importance of living an active and healthy life with a focus on physical fitness; they will also enjoy developing their gymnastics skills.

History – Our History unit on the Mayan civilisations continues; they will use comparison and contrast to compare this period of time with others they have learned of across KS2.

Computing – Spreadsheets: our children will work in a cross-curricular manner to handle a range of data using different software. Their work in science and PE will be enhanced by this unit of Computing. Online safety discussions will form part of our weekly discussions this half term, too.

PSHEE & Relationships – One World: this unit is based on the concept that we all have a responsibility to live as global citizens. It is inspired by the idea that we all have a responsibility to help the environment and all living things throughout the world through the choices we make.
